### Pastor Katie's Notes

Dear RCC,

There is an old joke that pastors only work on Sundays. (I didn't say it was a good joke!) But if the saying "many a true word is spoken in jest" is accurate, the "true word" of this joke is likely that the day-to-day work of a pastor is less noticeable than the very public work we do on Sunday mornings. I hope this article provides a little glimpse into how I spend my time.

I always aim for worship to go smoothly. With few distractions, we are better able to focus on the point of our worship: God! But it takes a lot of planning and prepara-



tion for every piece of the service to work just right. On average, I spend about 10 hours per week working on worship. That includes picking out hymns, recruiting volunteers, writing or choosing prayers, dreaming up worship themes, and researching, brainstorming, and writing an original sermon every week.

I also spend a lot of time on church communication, working with Deb to prepare the weekly email and monthly newsletter for our congregation while also maintaining our church website and social media pages to spread news about RCC more broadly.

Besides these two tasks, my work can vary quite a bit. Here are some of the things I've been up to in the last month:

- Met with the new Community Engagement Director of Caring Hands Outreach Center
- Participated in three regional meetings—one to help plan summer camp and two to plan the All-Congregational Gathering that will be held in Newton in October
- Prepared and led four evening Bible studies
- Attended a concert at Southeast Polk High School to watch three RCC youth perform
- Met with the pastors of Altoona Christian Church and Mitchellville Christian Church to plan our shared Maundy Thursday service
- Worked with Deb to fill out our 2022 yearbook report (we submit this to the denomination every year to maintain our tax-exempt non-profit status)
- Visited the Runnells Senior Center
- Started to design the 2023 VBS curriculum, "Welcome to the Neighborhood!"
- Made four in-person pastoral visits...and many, many more phone calls, texts, and emails!
- Attended meetings of the RCC Board, the RCC elders, and the RCC Congregational Life Committee

The variety in a pastor's day-to-day life has always been what has made ministry fun for me. Thank you for the privilege of being your pastor. You keep things interesting!



### What's Happening in the Empty Lot by the Church?

You have likely noticed construction of a new home just north of the church. We've been getting a few questions about it at the church office and want to clarify that the church has NEVER owned this piece of property. That was an empty lot that sat between the church's property and the existing home at 403 Brown Street. The lot was sold and is now being turned into a residence. RCC still owns the lot on the north corner of Brown St and E Maple and you are still free to park in the gravel parking lot for church events. ### **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

### 5th Sunday Project on April 30th

For our April 5th Sunday project, we are working with the Caring Bags Foundation in Newton. They distribute bags to displaced, abused, and disadvantaged children worldwide. Our goal at RCC is to collect enough items to fill 20 bags appropriate for 5-7 year olds. We will begin collecting items on April 3rd. There will be sign up sheets in the narthex for you to indicate what you plan to donate. One of the items that goes in every bag is a tied fleece blanket. If you have fleece, appropriate for a child's blanket (print or solid colors), we will take these donations, as well. On April 12, 19 & 26th, we will hold a blanket and bag making party at the church to make the 20 fleece blankets and 20 bags. We will need people to cut and tie the blankets, people to cut and iron the bags and people to sew. No experience necessary, but if you sew and can bring your sewing machine, please do! Everyone is invited to come and help. More information to follow about making the blankets. Below is a list of items we will be needing for the bags. All donations must be new. ### INTERNATIONAL MISSIONS

#### **Dominican Republic Mission Trip**

Zach Funk and Katie Temple joined 19 others to work with displaced Haitians in the Dominican Republic February 24 through March 3, 2023. The group of 21, mostly from Iowa, worked very hard building the parsonage on the second story of the Barranca church. They put up walls, cleaned the floors, brought many cement blocks, sand and gravel to the second story, built the forms, and started pouring the bond beam. They even decided to forego the trip to the beach so that they could push the project ahead. We held medical clinics for 2 days, and 3 days of dental clinics, treating over 335 people.

The pastors prayed over the people and gave a New Testament to all those who needed the Bible. Thank you to the outreach committee for the \$50 for the Creole Bibles and for the donations of medications and money for toys.

Please join Zach and Katie on April 16 at worship service, as we share about our trip.

Generous and faithful offerings enable the Dominican Missions organization to provide Christian education and daily meals in 14 different communities in and around La Vega. 


### 2023 Graduates

### Runnells Christian Church Scholarship Fund

In 2010 a scholarship fund was established for eligible youth in our congregation for higher education.





Guidelines to Apply for the Runnells Christian Church Scholarship Fund

The high school student must be accepted by an accredited college, university, or technical school, with a "C," or 2 point grade average. The student must be enrolled in a course of study leading to an accredited degree, associate or undergraduate.

### **Eligibility for Scholarships:**

- 1. Be an active member of the Runnells Christian Church, (Disciples of Christ), Runnells, Iowa.
- 2. Strive to attend church at least once a month.
- 3. Should maintain a minimum of regular attendance, at least once a month, in youth group. (prior to Covid-19)
- 4. Consideration for aid will be based upon character and personality, grade point average, and involvement in church activities.
- 5. Scholarship applications are due by **April 30, 2023** for the 2023-2024 academic year and can be submitted to the church office.

In youth Sunday school, we have been studying Lenten symbols. Please see our Lenten tree in the sanctuary.

### Camp Registration is now open!

New this year, registration is ONLINE ONLY. All applications and payments must be made through the registration portal at: www.newtonccc.org. If registering online is not an option for you or you have difficulty registering, please contact the camp office at 641-792-1266.

Once you have completed your registration please forward your confirmation email to the church office and the church will pay their share. Runnells Christian Church and our CWF will pay 50% of one camp for each child or youth. The camper pays 50%, the church pays 30% and CWF pays 20%. Scholarships are available through the Christian Conference Center for those in need. Please contact the church office for instructions on requesting a scholarship.

Please register for camp by **Sunday**, **April 23**. The church will then submit their portion of the payment before the May 1 early registration deadline.


For the past four years, Nick has enjoyed volunteering in various ways through the church. He's helped with can recycling, shoveling snow for elderly church members and as a junior diaconate.
