Pastor Katíe's Notes

Dear RCC,

I was talking with a friend recently about how to raise resilient children. Resiliency is not something we are born with; it is something we develop. And one of the best ways to develop resiliency is by shaping the stories we tell about ourselves. My friend shared that her child took longer to complete her math tests than her peers did. At first her child said, "I'm not good at math," but then eventually she said, "I'm not smart." My friend spent hours and hours working with her child on homework and study skills. Very recently her child said, "I can do



math! It takes me a little longer than the other kids, but I can even do the hard problems!" My friend was thrilled to hear that the story her child was telling about herself had changed from "I am not smart" to "With effort, I can do hard things!" She was telling a story of resiliency!

In the Bible, Matthew says crowds of sick people followed Jesus to be cured of their illnesses; they were like "sheep without a shepherd" and longed to hear Jesus preach Good News. The scriptures say that Jesus told his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." (Matthew 9:37-38, NRSV)

I've been thinking about these verses as we enter stewardship season at Runnells Christian Church because I've been wondering what kind of story we tell about our church. Is it a story about scarcity and how there aren't enough laborers? Or is it a story about opportunity and how much there is to harvest?

I like to tell the "harvest is plentiful" version of our story! When I tell the story of our church, I tell a story about a church that always rises to a challenge; in just a few weeks, we can fill a baptistery with 789 lbs of food for hungry families in our community! I tell a story about a church that is willing to try new things; when I hoped 10 women would go on a weekend retreat together, 15 signed up! I tell a story about a church that says "yes" more than it says "no," because it never wants to miss an opportunity to share God's love with others.

I tell these stories because I want to help build a resilient church—a church that will carry out its ministry even in adversity—so that Runnells Christian Church will be part of God's "plentiful harvest" for years and years to come.


Will you tell this story with me?


